










For 1400 years, the Takenouchi Kaido / Yokooji have continued to thrive even as their roles have changed over time.

What is "Japan Heritage"?

"Japan Heritage" refers to cultural assets certified by the Agency for Cultural Affairs that represent the country's cultural inheritance. Through their historical charm and local characteristics, these assets tell stories about the culture and traditions of Japan. The various regions are focused on comprehensively developing and using these various tangible and intangible cultural assets—indispensable to the telling of our stories—to promote them advantageously throughout Japan and around the world. In so doing, Japan's regions are being revitalized.

The Takenouchi Kaido / Yokooji were certified as the 44th asset of Japan Heritage in 2017, as "Takenouchi Kaido / Yokooji—the oldest public roads in Japan—reflecting the long history of more than 1,400 years."

What is Takenouchi Kaido / Yokooji?

A paragraph appearing in the "Chronicles of Japan" written in November 613 describes the Takenouchi Kaido as "a highway leading to the capital from Naniwa." Thus the highway—linking Naniwazu (the port serving as the gateway of continental diplomacy) and the capital Yamato Asuka—was built more than 1400 years ago.

The Official Story (Outline)

On the days of the spring and autumn equinoxes, the sun rises from Mt. Miwa, passes above Mt. Nijo, and sets in Osaka Bay. For this reason, the straight road from Nara in the east to Osaka in the west is known as the 'Road of the Sun'. The 'Road of the Sun', which is over 20 meters wide, was built by Empress Suiko in 613 AD. In ancient times, missionaries from China arrived in Asuka City through Naniwa (present-day Osaka) along this road and introduced technology and Buddhist culture. During the Middle Ages, the road connected many important trading towns, and in modern times it has flourished as a way station for people traveling on pilgrimages to the Grand Shrine of Ise in Mie Prefecture. The Takenouchi Kaido / Yokooji historic road offers travellers, depending on the location, a fascinating variety of scenes and experiences. Visitors to the heritage sites along this road will be able to encounter and appreciate the historical changes in the area over the past fourteen centuries.



Day 1

Sakai Kanaoka Shrine

Here is enshrined Koseno Kanaoka, an artist considered the father of the traditional Japanese painting style known as *yamato-e*. He was active in the position known as *edokoro-choja* (court painter) during the Heian period. A sacred tree on the site, estimated to be 900 years old, has been chosen as the City of Sakai's official tree and has been designated for preservation.

Matsubara Shibagaki-jinja Shrine

The ancient shrine marks the ruins of the Tajih-Shibagakinomiya Palace of Emperor Hanzei. According to legend, the emperor had beautiful teeth, and thus was considered the god of teeth. A shrine to teeth is located in the precincts, where a stone face with polished teeth can be seen.

Day 2

Katsuragi Taima-dera Temple

This ancient temple was built in 612. The principal image is believed to be the Taima Mandala by Princess Chujo-hime who is said to have woven Buddhists' Western Paradise with lotus thread in one night. Every April 14, visitors crowd the temple for *nerikuyo eshiki*, a marching ceremony to honor the dead.

Katsuragi Watayumi Mound

When haiku poet Matsuo Basho visited the hometown of his pupil Naemura Chiri, Basho composed a haiku. A stone tablet inscribed with his haiku was put on display. A former brewery on this site has been turned into a resting room for visitors. A collection of haiku can be seen here.

Yamatotakada Ryuoju Shrine

This place is assumed to be the ruins of the Katashiono Ukianomiya Palace of Emperor Anrei. Legend holds that a dragon lies on Yokooji, with Omiwa Jinja Shrine as its head, this shrine as its body, and Nagao-jinja Shrine as its tail.

Osaka City Shitennoji Temple

This temple, representative of the Asuka period, was built by Prince Shotoku. Designated as a National Historic Site, the temple houses many important cultural properties such as the *hojo* of the *honbo* (priests' main living quarters) and Rokujido Hall. The spectacular Honbo Garden is open to the public.

Sakai Risho no Mori

In this museum, one can experience the charm of Sakai by reflecting on the lives of Sakai's own distinguished historical figures, Sen no Rikyu and Yosano Akiko. Partake of tea and sweets while seated in a conventional chair, or experience the traditional formal manners of the tea ceremony in the tearoom facing the site of the Sen no Rikyu residence. (reservations required.)

Taishi Takenouchi Kaido History Museum

The exhibit shows the relationship between Japan's oldest official road and Taishi Town. In the first exhibition room, a video introducing the local history is presented, while ancient documents and excavated artifacts are on display in the second exhibition room.

Sakurai Abe Monjuin Temple

This is one of the oldest temples in Japan, constructed at the time of the Taika Reform. The principal image, the largest Bodhisattva Manjusri in Japan, has been designated a national treasure.

Japan's only continental-style cave temple



Taishi Iwaya

This continental-style cave temple comprises large and small caves constructed during the Nara period. No records of this temple exist in the literature, and details of the ruins of this temple remain a mystery.

Kashihara Yagi Fudanotsuji

This is the intersection of Yokooji and Shimotsu-michi. It is a key intersection on Japan's ancient transportation routes. In early-modern times, this area became quite crowded with pilgrims to Ise Grand Shrine and Mount Omine.

Japan's oldest statue of Buddha

Asuka Asuka-dera Temple



Japan's oldest authentic temple is believed to have been built in 588 by Soga no Umako when Busshari (Buddha's ashes) were conveyed from Baekje, the ancient Korean kingdom. The seated statue of Shaka Nyorai (Asuka Daibutsu) by the sculptor Tori Bussai is now considered Japan's oldest representation of Buddha.

Engineers from Baekje were involved in the construction of the towers, building tiles, and Buddhist halls, and their apprentices eventually took part in the construction of temples across Japan.

Enjoy a tasting of five carefully selected sake samples from this brewery, renowned for its choice products such as Mimurosuji. Cycle Through History

Yamato Sanzan

Mt. Miminashiyama Mt. Unebiyama Mt. Kaguyama

Mt. Miminashiyama

Peaking at 139.6 m, this is the northernmost of Yamato Sanzan. Some believe it is actually a tumulus constructed in ancient times, formed as a dome-shaped mound on a square base. Mt. Miminashiyama Park, toward the south, is well maintained.

Mt. Unebiyama

Rising 198.8 m, this is the highest of Yamato Sanzan. Mt. Unebiyama, signifying "rolling fire," was so named because of its many winding ridges.

Mt. Kaguyama

Described as Amano Kaguyama in *Manyōshū* (the oldest anthology of tanka poetry), this mountain rises to a height of 152.4 m. The most sacred of Yamato Sanzan, it is said to feature a power spot at the Shrine of the Three Pillars.

Fujiwara-kyo

Fujiwara Kyo was the site of the central facilities of the country such as Daigokuden (main administrative building) and Chodojin (government office). For 16 years it was the first emulsion of the Tang capital until the transfer of the capital to Heian.

In 1890, Kanpei-taisha (a large-scale state shrine) was built by Emperor Meiji to enshrine the Emperor Jimmu, considered Japan's first emperor, and his empress.

The area adjacent to the Takenouchi Kaido / Yokooji is dotted with many mounded tombs, or ancient burial mounds (known as *kofun* in Japanese). A bicycle tour of the mounds is a great way to see the area.

44 mounded tombs still remain in evidence today within a 2 km radius.



Richu-tenno-ryo Kofun

This is the third-largest keyhole-shaped tumulus in Japan. It is one of the three Mozu imperial mausoleums built in the early 5th century.

Nintoku-tenno-ryo Kofun

This is Japan's largest keyhole-shaped tomb and is considered one of the world's three most significant tombs. The mounds are constructed in three tiers, encircled with three moats and contain more than 10 smaller mounded tombs.




Observation Lobby, 21st floor of Sakai City Hall

Asuka Pilgrimage

A rental bicycle is the best way to explore the kofuns (tumuli, or ancient burial mounds), ruins, and stone artifacts of Asuka Village.



Ishibutai Tumulus

This seventh-century kofun, or tumulus, was formed by stacking about 30 megalithic stones to form a stone chamber. The fill has been lost and the exposed upper surface is flat, so it referred to as a "stone stage." One theory holds that this is the burial mound of Soga no Umako.

Tachibana-dera Temple

This is one of the seven great temples erected by Prince Shotoku. His seated statue is enshrined as a principal image of the main hall, which is called Taishiden (a temple dedicated to the Imperial Prince Shotoku).


Oka-dera Temple

Officially named Ryugai-ji, this temple is widely known as the first sacred place in Japan that wards off evil. Its principal image is one of the three large Buddhas forming Japan's largest clay statue, Nyoirin Kanzeon Bosatsu, which stands 4.6 m tall.


Kameishi (Tortoise Stone)

Legend holds that a snake and catfish battled over the lake that once filled the entire Nara basin. The snake prevailed, later drawing up all the water from the lake. After all the lake turtles had died from lack of water, villagers are said to have taken pity on the creatures and created this turtle stone, or *kameishi*, for the repose of their spirits.

Kitora Tumulus

This two-level burial mound has attracted interest for its stone chamber containing a continental-style colored tomb mural. It depicts an astronomical chart; the twelve signs of the Chinese zodiac; and the four gods Genbu, Seiryu, Byakko, and Suzaku.

Takamatsuzuka Tumulus

This two-level round burial mound from the Fujiwara Kyo period marks the final stage of the Kofun period. It suddenly came into the spotlight when a richly colored mural painting of a group of women was discovered in 1972.


The Takenouchi Kaido offers a treasure trove of kofun mounded tombs!

Habikino, Osaka (Fujiidera) Furuichi Mounded Tomb Group

A total of 45 mounded tombs can be seen within a 2-km radius located along east-west and north-south axes. Many iron weapons and impressive tomb artifacts have been found in this area.

Ojin-tenno-ryo Kofun

This enormous mounded tomb is the second largest in Japan after the Nintoku-tenno-ryo Kofun. Its volume is the largest of all mounded tombs in Japan. The hills and slopes of the mound are adorned with *fukishi* (stones used to cover a mounded tomb) and it contains more than 20,000 cylindrical *haniwa* (clay figures) arranged in rows.

Hakuchoryo Kofun

Constructed in the second half of the 5th century, this keyhole-shaped mound rises 23 meters and is 200 meters long. Along a path extending from the Takenouchi Highway to the north of the mound, a reflection of this beautiful keyhole-shaped mound can be seen on the surface of the large moat.

Minegazuka Kofun

Minegazuka Kofun, Minezuka Park Administration Building

Of all the large keyhole-shaped tomb mounds in the Furuichi Mounded Tomb Group, only this mounded tomb has had its interior excavated for ongoing research. You can learn more about Furuichi Mounded Tomb Group in the adjacent Minezuka Park Administration Building.

Cherry Blossoms Takada "Senbonzakura" (Yamatotakada)

In bloom from late March to early April. Onaka Park features 2.5 km of cherry trees that extend along both sides of the river to the north and south. ■ Onaka, Yamatotakada, Nara



Cherry Blossoms Osaka Castle Park (Osaka City)

In bloom from late March to early April. About 3,000 cherry trees bloom in this park. About 300 of them are located around Someiyoshino in the Nishinomaru Garden. The cherry blossoms are illuminated at night. ■ 1 Osaka-jo, Chuo-ku, Osaka






